



The last few years have been trying for our community, but one thing is certain—Volunteer Transportation Center continues to make a difference embodying the true meaning of volunteerism. Our core group of 250+ volunteers across our service area stepped up in a meaningful way continuing to transport folks to medical care appointments and ensure access to food sources. This includes critical services such as daily/weekly dialysis treatment, or cancer treatment. For the constituents in your town this was most likely lifesaving.

Last year, our Volunteers performed over 87 one-way trips, and provided 2,627 miles of service to all of our clients. Meeting this critical need in <u>your</u> community is accomplished by a dedicated group of volunteer drivers that use their own vehicles, and receive mileage reimbursement to perform this service.

The clients of the Volunteer Transportation Center and I would like to extend our heartfelt appreciation to you and the Town Board for your ongoing support of our programs. As I understand it, more than 15 years ago the towns were first asked to help finance transportation for their constituents. Our target has remained unchanged until now, however, we have seen an increased need for rural transportation services. The funds allocated to this campaign are strictly used to reimburse volunteers for mileage. With that in mind, we are respectfully asking the Town of Denmark to contribute \$1,875 in 2024.


